About Goriški letnik

Goriški letnik: zbornik Goriškega muzeja [Goriški letnik: Miscellany of the Regional Museum Goriški muzej] is the central publication discussing humanistic topics relating to the historical region of Goriška (Northern Primorska region). The publication mostly contains original scientific and scholarly articles from the field of archaeology, history, ethnology, art history and other humanities, which bring new knowledge of the region. They are published by researchers from domestic and foreign institutions. Articles are published in the Slovenian language, only exceptionally in a foreign language. The abstracts are in English or Italian, while the summaries are in Slovenian. The publication contains many technically advanced drawings, photographs, plans, tables, maps and charts.

The publication is issued once a year, in December. It has been published in printed form since 1974. Digitized issues, which are no longer available for sale, are available on the website. The authors are free to use their articles in the PDF format.

Ethical principles of *Goriški letnik*:

Duties of the editor and editorial board:

- The editor of the journal *Goriški letnik* decides which of the submitted articles are suitable for publication in the journal. In the process, the editor follows the policies of the journal's editorial board and may consult with the editorial board or reviewers when making a decision.
- The editor sends out each article for review to two independent reviewers, who are generally experts in the topic, period or place covered by the article (peer review).
- The editor and members of the editorial board must not disclose information about the submitted manuscript to anyone, apart from its author or reviewers.
- The editor sets a deadline (schedule) by which the reviewer must perform the review. The deadline set by the editor can be changed only if so agreed between the editor and reviewer.

Duties of reviewers:

- The reviewer gives an objective and expert assessment, which helps the editor to make a decision. By communicating with the author through the editor, the reviewer may help the author to improve the article.
- Each selected reviewer who does not feel qualified to review the manuscript or who
 knows that he/she will be unable to perform the review within the deadline set by
 the editor, shall be obligated to inform the editor of this and withdraw from the
 review.
- The review process is anonymous. The reviewers must handle all manuscripts received for review as confidential documents. They must not show them to others, discuss them with others, or use them for their own gain.

Duties of authors:

- The information presented in the article, on which the research work is based, must be authentic and accurate. The article must contain enough details and references that can later be cited by other authors and verified by reviewers.
- When writing articles, the authors must abide by the author guidelines which are published in each issue of the journal and on the journal's website.
- The authors certify that their articles are original scientific works and the result of their own research, or if they used the work and/or words of other authors that they have properly quoted or cited them.
- The editorial office shall not accept texts which have already been published or which are undergoing review at another publication. The authors certify that they have not yet published the main research results in other scientific publications.
- The author must always properly cite the works of other authors that have contributed significantly to the creation of his/her article. Information obtained by the author privately must not be used or reported without the express, written permission of the source.
- If the article has more than one author, all authors must consent to the publication.
- The authors of articles shall be responsible for obtaining permission to publish copyrighted visuals.
